HEDGEHOG HOSPITAL

Would you know what to do if you find a hedgehog with an injury or are concerned for its welfare?

The volunteers at Holderness Hedgehog hospital are there to help, you can contact them on their dedicated emergency number 07563 917 914.

If a hedgehog needs rescuing you will need a high-sided box (as they can climb), something to cover the hedgehog such as an old towel or fleece, then move the box out of the sunlight. Please ensure you wear gloves as they can carry parasites that pass to humans, and fleas but they are host specific and will not transfer to you. Hedgehogs can have internal parasites that need medication, so contacting the rescue centre as soon as possible is vital. Hedgehog's health can decline very quickly so please do not try to care for the hog yourself.

Hedgehogs are in serious decline, it is estimated that numbers have reduced from 30 million in the UK to around 1 million, so they need our help before they disappear altogether.

With hedgehogs being nocturnal, they should not be seen in daylight, but there are a few exceptions such as a female with young, she may be moving nest sites or having a break, if so she will be moving about with a purpose.

Hedgehogs don't sunbathe, so during the heatwave and warm weather hogs can become dehydrated, even if you don't think you have any in your garden please leave out a shallow dish of water for them,



but not milk as they are lactose intolerant, but they do love cat biscuits. There is lots of advice regarding the care of hogs, on www.holdernesshedgehoghospital.org. Their Facebook page is Holderness Hedgehog Hospital.

Please contact the centre by phone as FB messages or e-mail are not routinely monitored.

Hedgehog fun fact:

The hedgehog was not always called a hedgehog. Before this, it was called an urchin which led to the naming of sea urchins.

GIGABIT BROADBAND FOR RURAL COMMUNITIES
