

Minutes of the Roos Parish Council Meeting held in the Memorial Institute, Roos on Monday 10th August 2015

Present: Cllrs D Winter (Chair), W Ainley, A Coupe, J Cracknell, A Dodson and K Tyson.

There were no apologies for absence as all members were present.

1. Consideration of Councillor's declaration of interests

There were no changes declared by members to the register of interests.

2. Minutes of the meeting held on 13 July 2015

These were agreed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

Matters arising from the minutes

3. Tunstall coastal defence scheme

A reply from ERYC indicated that its Estates Section had forwarded revised heads of terms to the owners land agent together with a request for details of any accommodation works his client may require to which a reply was awaited.

4. Roos notice board

It was reported that the notice board had been renovated and erected at the new location by Cllrs Dodson and Tyson and they were thanked for their workmanship.

5. ERYC draft Local Plan

Cllr Cracknell reported that she attended County Hall recently and had made representations on behalf of the Council to the planning inspector citing pressure on the school, doctor's surgery and infrastructure and increased vehicular traffic relevant to the proposed extension of residential development at ROO-A Beechwood Views.

6. Tedder Hill Wind farm Community Benefit Fund

The Chair confirmed that all members had been circulated with documentation provided by Bill Marwood of Burton Pidsea relevant to a local transport survey which had been undertaken and two bids made to the fund to operate two pilot transport schemes linking the villages to Hedon.

The contents were noted and it was agreed that the community be surveyed seeking opinion and that Cllrs Ainley, Cracknell and Tyson prepare a mono transport survey form in consultation with ERYC.

7. Highway issues

A reply from ERYC confirmed that the Community Payback team had been sent details of siding works required to the footway along South End leading to Lamb Lane and that potholes in South Park would be attended to in the near future.

8. Roos Beck

A reply from ERYC confirmed that enforcing riparian owners to clear their sections of the beck would not be considered until after the vegetation has begun to die back in

the autumn and that it would not be appropriate at present to undertake an early inspection walk of the beck and it was agreed that the issue be revisited in October.

9. B1242/Owstwick Road junction

The Clerk reported that he had been informed by ERYC that visibility improvements to the junction could not be considered as there had been no road traffic accidents in recent years at the location and it was agreed that the owner be contacted directly to enquire if he would improve visibility at the junction.

10. Casual vacancies

The Clerk confirmed that he had invited Ann Wall and Bob Smales to the September meeting following their co-option onto the Council.

Correspondence

11. East Riding parish news

The latest edition was circulated for members' individual attention.

12. Commemorative medal

A request was received from Roos CE Primary School for the Council to consider either buying 125 longest reigning monarch medals for distribution to each pupil or contributing towards the cost. It was agreed to purchase 125 medals and Cllr Ward offered to check on the number of up to 16 year olds who would also be provided with a medal.

13. Telemetry systems at Roos Beck

Notification was received from ERYC that the systems would not be funded from April 2016 as a result of funding cuts and the fact that there had not been many significant alarms or concerns with the beck. It was agreed to ask ERYC how much it would cost to maintain the systems beyond April 2016.

Planning

Erection of detached garage at Mayfield Farm Tower Road Hilston

Erection of two storey extension to existing outbuilding at The Chestnuts Rectory Road Roos

It was reported that ERYC had approved the above two applications.

Crown reduce horse chestnut to 5/6 metres high and carry out remedial work to scots pines

It was reported that the above application had been withdrawn.

14. Treasurer's report

The Treasurer sought and received approval for payment of the following accounts:-

15. Memorial Institute

Cllr Ainley commented that the Institute should perhaps consider applying to one of the wind farm community benefit funds for the installation of wi fi facilities at the premises and Cllr Tyson offered to make Mr/Mrs Cheeseman aware of the suggestion.

A member of the public referred to speeding vehicles on Rectory Road and the Chair advised that matters were in hand in consultation with the Police and a resident to conduct a speed survey on the road in the near future.
