Matters arising from the minutes

3. Transport consultation

It was reported that ERYC's Cabinet had recently approved the retention of the 173 EYMS Saturday morning bus service and that funding for the Pearson 76c bus service would be withdrawn from April 2018.

4. East Coast Community Fund

It was confirmed that the fund had now been launched and that members had been circulated prior with the details for which the closing date for initial applications was the 31st March. Cllr Ainley commented that he had uploaded the information to the website and that he had drafted an article for publication by The Rooster.

5. Emergency Plan
