

Minutes of the Roos Parish Council Meeting held in the Memorial Institute, Roos on Monday 11th May 2015

Present: Cllrs D Winter (Chairman), W Ainley, A Coupe, J Cracknell, A Dodson and J Ward.

An apology was received from Cllr K Tyson.

1. Consideration of Councillor's declaration of interests

There were no changes declared by members to the register of interests.

2. Minutes of the meeting held on 13th April 2015

These were agreed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

Matters arising from the minutes

3. Tunstall coastal defence scheme

A further response from ERYC stated that a letter outlining the agreement details had been sent to Mr Smales agent requesting details of any accommodation works his client may require during the construction period to which a reply was awaited.

4. Roos notice board

It was reported that the existing notice board was unsuitable for relocating to the Black Horse car park on Hodgson Lane and it was agreed to explore the possibility of acquiring one similar to that in Hedon for possible erection near to the junction of Main Street and footpath no.5.

5. Dog fouling

Reference was made to continued dog fouling in Hodgson Lane and Cllr Cracknell agreed to take the matter up with the ERYC dog warden.

6. Coastal Community teams and Coastal Heritage revival fund

A response from Ward Cllr Hodgson stated that the Council's interest in the proposed establishment of the above teams with additional funding to help the revival of at risk coastal heritage had been noted and that the Council would be kept informed as the initiative developed.

In relation to the Coastal Opportunities Gateway project a further update from ERYC confirmed the progress to date and provided a provisional scheme delivery timetable.

7. ERYC draft Local Plan

The Clerk read an objection he had forwarded in relation to the proposed extension of residential development at ROO-A Beechwood Views to the east by a further six indicative properties.

8. The Pinfold wall

A further quote was received and it was reported that another quote would be sought from Mr Metcalf as three quotes required submitting to the Burton Pidsea Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund for funding consideration.

9. The Rooster

Cllr Ainley reported that the fledgling committee was gradually drafting a constitution in order to allow for the publication to once again be published and for which he was providing assistance where possible.

10. Wind farm Community Benefit Funds

It was confirmed that publicity material had now been provided by ERYC in relation to Tedder Hill with limited material evident in respect of the Burton Pidsea scheme.

11. East Riding parish news

The latest edition was circulated for members' individual attention.

Planning

Erection of single and two storey extension to the rear at Cairn Cottage Hilston Road Roos -15/01177/PLF

It was agreed that no objections be made to the above application.

Erection of garage to side/rear alterations to windows doors and balcony to front following demolition of existing garage at The Paddock South End Roos -15/01384

It was agreed that no objections be made to the above application on condition that the previous application for the erection of four dwellings following demolition of the dwelling the subject of this application is withdrawn.

Erection of pig finishing units and related feed bins at Glebe Farm Hilston Road Roos

Remove conifer tree and leylandii hedge at Westside Main Street Roos

It was reported that ERYC had approved the above two applications.

12. Emergency Plan update

Cllr Cracknell reported that she would be working closely with Cllr Ward in canvassing particular residents in order to update the plan.

13. Treasurer's report

14. Highway issues

It was reported that a resident had complained of motorists speeding and tractors driving over grass verges on Rectory Road and Cllr Cracknell agreed to investigate and pursue the matters.

Cllr Dodson reported that he would attend to a section of overgrown hedge on footpath no.5 at Main Street and it was agreed to refer potholes in South Park to ERYC for attention.

15. Casual vacancies

It was agreed to advertise the Councillor vacancies in the usual manner.

16. Transparency in local government

Cllr Ainley raised the matter of transparency in making the work of the Council particularly in relation to the parish website more accessible to the public and he agreed to provide the Clerk with the sources of the information he had acquired.

17. Rural health checks

It was agreed that enquiries be made of the possibility of the NHS health bus visiting Roos to carry out health checks and to initially liaise and discuss the matter with the local medical practice.

18. Volunteer project

The Chair reported that he would be attending an event in Burton Pidsea in mid May in respect of an initiative for 11 to 25 year olds which supports and encourages young people to become involved and be active in their local communities.

19. Annual parish assembly

It was agreed that the above take place on 10th August prior to the normal monthly Council meeting.

20. RES Wind farm Community Benefit Fund

It was reported that it was understood that eleven applications for funding had been received which would be considered by the fund panel on the 26th May.
