

Minutes of the Roos Parish Council Meeting held in the Memorial Institute, Roos on Monday 12th September 2016

Present: Cllrs D Winter (Chair), W Ainley, J Cracknell, A Dodson and M Maltas.

Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs B Smales, K Tyson and J Ward.

1. Consideration of Councillor's declaration of interests

There were no changes declared by members to the register of interests.

2. Minutes of the meeting held on 8th August 2016

These were agreed as a true record and signed by the Chair.

Matters arising from the minutes

3. Coastal Opportunities Gateway

A reply from ERYC indicated that in principle the project board had agreed to the replacement/addition of litter bins, benches and signs in Tunstall and Roos and renovation works at Tunstall Village Hall together with an interpretive sign for The Pinfold.

4. Emergency Plan

The Chair and Cllr Cracknell reported that they had recently met to commence the process of updating the plan and that it was hoped that a meeting would be held with Alan Bravey at ERYC in the near future for his input in moving the project forward.

5. Speeding vehicles – Pilmar Lane

A reply from ERYC confirmed that Humberside Police had been requested to again carry out speed enforcement at the location.

6. Telephone kiosk in Main Street

A reply from BT confirmed that an engineer would carry out repair works and clean the payphone facility in the near future.

7. Rectory Road

A communication from ERYC indicated that the estimated cost of providing a footpath from Hodgson Lane to the crossroads without kerbing or drainage considerations would be in the region of £70,000.00. Further that ERYC's potential three funding sources had been looked into and unfortunately in the current financial climate there was little prospect of funding a new footpath in the foreseeable future.

8. Police report

The report highlighted theft from a caravan at Sand Le Mere Caravan Park.

9. East Riding Rural Strategy 2016 - 2020 final draft

The Clerk confirmed that he had previously circulated the documentation to members.

Planning

11. Roos Churchyard

Cllr Dodson referred to an overgrown section of the churchyard which a team of volunteers would be attempting to improve the condition of in the coming weekend and he explained that there was difficulty in obtaining the services of regular volunteers to carry out the work. It was suggested that an appeal for volunteers be highlighted in an issue of The Rooster.

12. Transport consultation

It was agreed to notify ERYC that the Council would wish to see the retention of the Saturday morning 173 bus service to Hull which was earmarked for cancellation from April 2017.

13. Parked vehicles on Hilston Road

Cllr Maltas referred to potential parking issues and it was agreed to monitor the situation over the coming weeks.

Public session

A member of the public referred to the apparent lack of road sweeping/gulley emptying on Rectory Road and it was agreed to ask ERYC of the frequencies for such operations.
